# Know Your Coach

This Month - Ste Potter, Under 10s Coach and Committee Member



## Q. What brought you to join Parkdale Sidac FC as a coach?

I was never really into Football with my eldest son, mainly due to work commitments. I wanted to support my youngest and brought him to Parkdale - tried Penlake but it was chaos!!! Jamie who was coaching back then was struggling with all the kids and asked for help and I decided to help with a few other of the guys and it went from there.

## Q. How are you different to other coaches at the club?

I wouldn't say I am any different than any other coach - very similar actually as we are all in it for the kids, commit a lot of time and enjoy the social aspects that the role brings with it. Perhaps I am a bit more vocal than some, especially after having a few pints in Sidac Club!

## Q. What has been the highlight in your time at Parkdale?

Two things spring to mind, seeing my own lad develop is one of the proudest parts of being a coach, knowing that you are involved with his development every single day. Also, after our first season we had a young lad who struggled to kick a ball, but the improvements he made after the first year led to us presenting him on stage with the 'most improved trophy' - this was a real lump in the throat moment for me.

## Q. What qualities have you gained and brought to your team?

Being in management previously has made me aware of how complex coaching kids can be as you are not just coaching kids but managing parent's expectations as well, as well as being a role model for the kids. It's tough managing the 'non-competitive' side of the game yet this has helped me turn down my own desire to succeed if you like, and ensure more than anything that the kids are enjoying everything. (I do still have the desire to succeed before any of my parents have a go at me haha, and this clearly comes out on match days).

## Q. What mistakes have you made during your time at the club?

My toughest test has been and still is 'Coaches Dad Syndrome!!' I am undoubtedly tougher on my own lad Reece than the rest of the squad.....Need a sub coming off at a critical time of the game....Reece!! - Need a sub starting off on a cup tournament when all the kids want to start.....Reece!! - He puts up with a lot and gets irate sometimes, well a lot of the times, and this has to be the hardest part of the role; trying to coach and support him and support the other players as well. I sometimes forget I am also a parent after all as well not just a coach.

## Q. What are your thoughts on how the club is being run?

I can say without a shadow of a doubt that the Committee are the right people to be involved in running the club. There is a great energy when we are together and we are really lucky to have the experience (and challenges) of Keith, Andy and Paul as well as the other hands on coaches on the committee.

## Q. If you could change anything at Parkdale, what would it be?

There's a lot of work going on behind the scenes in getting Parkdale and Sidac working even closer together, and I am extremely confident that over the coming months that this bond can improve even more as both will be supporting each other. Both committees rely on feedback and support from their members and this is exactly what we need going into 2018.

## Q. Being part of the club committee entails a lot of time at meetings and work behind the scenes, what is your motivation?

Being single at the moment helps a lot! hahaha ( not through the lack of trying though!) Spending some quality time with the kids, watching them grow in both skills and maturity is a real reward in itself (a bit like being a teacher but not having the hassle of marking books) . Working with a committed team to improve kids' lives, what more do you need?!?
